Introduction

In 1965, J. Milton Henry, who taught history at Austin Peay State University from 1947 to 1978, was given a contract by the Tennessee Valley Authority to gather sources for a history of the Land Between the Rivers region of Tennessee and Kentucky. area includes land between the Cumberland and Tennessee Rivers in Trigg and Lyon Counties and Stewart County of Kentucky and Tennessee respectively. One result was the publication of his Land Between the Rivers in 1976. Another was the assembling of a formidable volume of research materials which he donated to the Woodward Library upon his retirement. Soon after, Arthur Goldsmith, university archivist and research librarian, placed much of the material into acid-free folders and provided some labelling and organization. This corpus, which we have called "The J. Milton Henry Collection, " was placed by Mr. Goldsmith into eight drawers of two sets of file cabinets in the Tennesseeana Room of the Woodward Library. As access is restricted, researchers must get permission to use the collection from the reference librarian on duty.

During the summer of 1990, the following calendar of the collection was prepared under the auspices of the Center for Field Biology of the Land Between the Lakes and of the Department of History and Philosophy. The goal, of course, is to facilitate research into the natural and human history of the region.

The collection itself is composed of generally three types of material. The first are the Hillman Papers, which are a collection of records kept by John N. Esselstyn, manager for the Hillman Land and Iron Company and then of the Hillman Land Company from 1915 to 1936. The company's holdings were primarily in Lyon and Trigg Counties of Kentucky. The second are the Henry Research Papers, a diverse assortment of both primary and secondary sources on the history of the area. The third are the academic papers of J. Milton Henry related to his teaching career. These latter papers are separately calendared. A guide to them is available on request to the reference librarian, Woodward Library.

The Hillman Papers, containing material dated from 1913 to 1945, plus some unrelated tubes and rolls, are located in five file drawers. These drawers are labeled in order from top to bottom: "Hillman Papers," "Hillman Land and Iron Co., 220-275," and "Hillman Land and Iron Co., 276-MISC." The last two drawers are unlabeled. The calendar below notes these labels in brackets with quotation marks.

The Henry Research Papers are in three drawers. The first is labeled "Henry Papers," which includes material on the LBL Project calendared below, as well as files related to his academic career, which were separately calendared. Next come drawers labeled "Family Histories, Early Iron Grants, Iron Industry" and "Industry & Transportation, Wars, social structure, recent history, misc." In the same cabinet following the Henry Collection are two drawers of unrelated materials, the "Philomathic Papers."

The Hillman Papers are organized within each drawer into numbered files as determined by the company itself. Judging by the missing numbers and internal references to other files numbered higher than the existing 286, this collection contains approximately half of the originals held by Mr. Esselstyn. The fate of the missing portions is unknown. The Henry Research Papers are haphazardly filed. The titles of each file give only the vaguest indication of content. Users of this calendar and collection are urged to read the contents guide carefully and to check all files during their research which might appear at all relevant to the interests.

This is a most remarkable resource for local history. Enjoy it.
