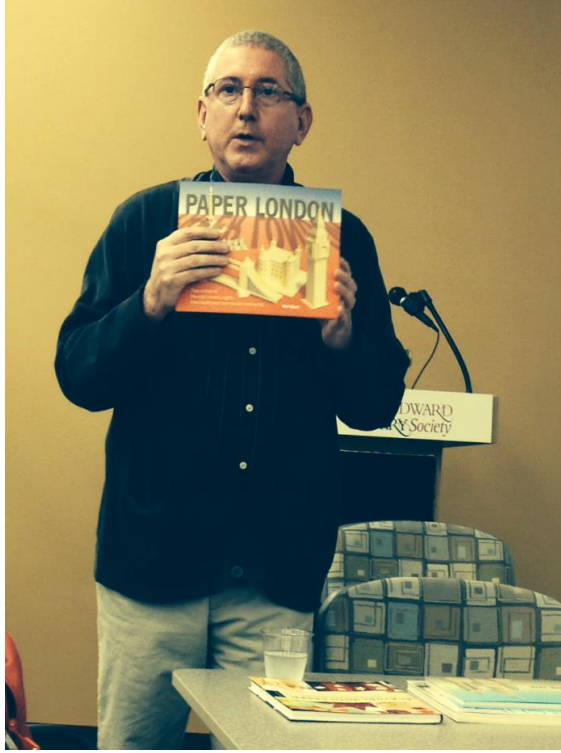


Fall Program: The Talented and Funny Kell Black

Kell Black shows his book *Paper London*

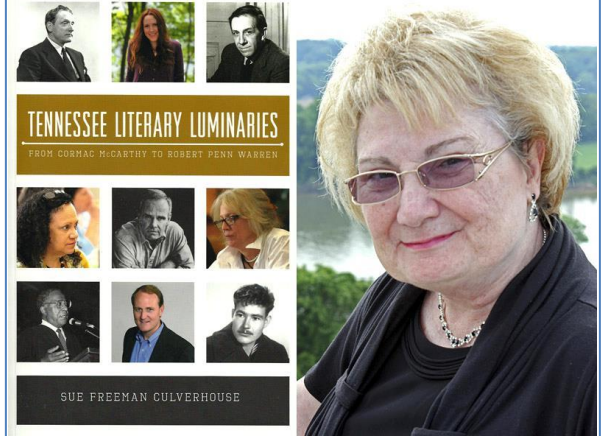
Motoring Back in the Day

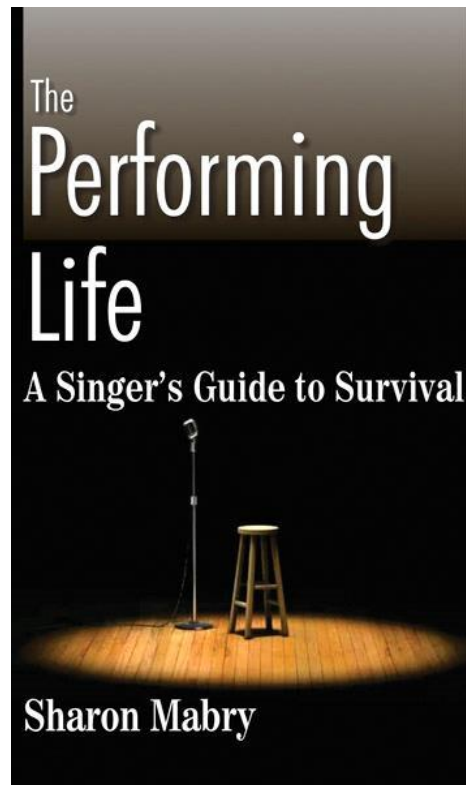


Funding Information Resources
