

**Woodward Library
Research Instruction Offerings Summary
Summer 2014**

During summer 2014, librarians taught a total of 24 instruction sessions, a small increase over the 23 sessions conducted the previous summer. Two thirds of the instruction was face-to-face, while in one third of the sessions librarians were embedded in online courses. Of these online courses, two were at APSU and six were via the Regent's Online Degree Program (RODP) / Regent's Online Campus Collaborative (ROCC). Three of the sessions were not part of a course, but were outreach opportunities; two were for the Science & Mathematics Academy (SAMA), a program for high school students, while the other was for the TRiO Technology Bridge Program students.

By College, there were seven sessions from courses in Arts & Letters (4 in English, 1 in Communications, 1 in Linguistics, and 1 in Music). There were five sessions in Education, one in Science & Mathematics, and one in Technology & Public Management. There was one Graduate online course through APSU, while librarians were embedded in six graduate-level courses via RODP (4 Nursing and 2 Professional Studies).

Ten librarians conducted these information literacy sessions during the course of the summer.
