

**Woodward Library  
Research Instruction Offerings Summary  
Summer 2015**

During summer 2015, librarians taught a total of 26 instruction sessions, a slight 8% increase over the 24 sessions conducted the previous summer. There were 16 face-to-face sessions, while librarians were embedded in ten online courses. Of these online courses, three were at APSU and seven were via the Regent's Online Degree Program (RODP) / Regent's Online Campus Collaborative (ROCC). Of the face-to-face sessions, five were not part of a course, but were outreach opportunities: two were for the Science & Mathematics Academy (SAMA), a program for high school students, two were outreach to Stewart County public librarians and school teachers to promote the resources of the Tennessee Electronic Library (TEL), and another was for the campus TRiO Technology Bridge Program students.

For the face-to-face sessions, by College, there were eight sessions from courses in Arts & Letters (4 in English, 2 in History, 1 in Communications, 1 in Linguistics). There were two sessions in Education, and one in Science & Mathematics. For the embedded sessions, there was one Graduate online course through APSU, while librarians were embedded in six graduate-level courses via RODP (4 Nursing and 2 Professional Studies).

Eight librarians conducted these information literacy sessions during the course of the summer.
