

**Woodward Library
Research Instruction Offerings Summary
Summer 2016**

During summer 2016, librarians taught a total of 24 instruction sessions, a slight 8% decrease over the 26 sessions conducted the previous summer. There were 13 face-to-face sessions. Of the face-to-face sessions, seven were not part of a course, but were workshops conducted by library faculty as outreach opportunities: two for the online Nursing students, one for the graduate students in Math Education, one for the campus History Club, one for the campus TRiO Technology Bridge students, and two for the Science & Mathematics Academy (SAMA), a program for area high school students. For course-specific instruction, there were four sessions from the College of Arts & Letters (3 in English and 1 in History), and two sessions as part of the APSU 1000 – Transition to the University course. As for the embedded sessions, there was one Graduate online Leadership course through APSU and ten graduate-level Nursing courses via RODP/ROCC/Tennessee e-Campus.

Ten librarians conducted these information literacy sessions during the course of the summer.
