Research Instruction Offerings Summary
Summer 2017

During summer 2017, librarians taught a total of 15 face-to-face instruction sessions, a 37.5% decrease over the 24 sessions conducted the previous summer. Of the total sessions, ten were part of a course, while five were workshops conducted by librarians: one for new faculty, one for the campus TRiO Technology Bridge students, one for the dually enrolled students and their families, and two for the Science & Mathematics Academy (SAMA), a program for area high school students. For course-specific instruction, there were four sessions from the College of Arts & Letters (2 in English and 2 in Communication), one in Behavioral & Health Sciences (Nursing), one in STEM (Radiologic Technology), and four sessions as part of the APSU 1000 – Transition to the University course.

As for the embedded sessions, there was one Graduate online Leadership course through APSU and nine graduate-level Nursing courses via RODP/ROCC/Tennessee e-Campus.

Nine librarians conducted these information literacy sessions during the course of the summer.
