Research Instruction Offerings Summary
Summer 2018

During summer 2018, librarians taught a total of eleven face-to-face instruction sessions, a 26% decrease over the 15 sessions conducted the previous summer. Of the total sessions, six were part of a course, while five were workshops conducted by librarians: one for new faculty; one for graduate students in mathematics; one for the campus TRiO Technology Bridge students; and two for our dually enrolled students and their families. For course-specific instruction, there were five sessions from the College of Arts & Letters (two in English, two in History, and one in Communication) and one in STEM (Biology).

There was a huge increase of 244% in the number of online courses in which librarians were embedded from summer 2017 to summer 2018. In 2017, librarians were embedded in nine online courses, but in 2018, that number jumped to 31 courses. Librarians were embedded in four online graduate Leadership courses, one online graduate Education course, one undergraduate Leadership course, and two APSU 1000 freshman seminar courses through APSU. The Health Sciences librarian was embedded in 23 graduate-level Nursing courses via the Tennessee e-Campus.

Nine librarians provided information literacy in face-to-face sessions or were embedded online during the course of the summer.
