Research Instruction Offerings Summary
Summer 2019

During summer 2019, librarians taught a total of 13 face-to-face instruction sessions, an increase of 18% compared to the 11 sessions conducted the previous summer. Of the total sessions, eight were part of a course, while five were workshops conducted by librarians: two for dual enrollment students; one for TRIO students; one for new faculty; and one for Nursing faculty. For course-specific instruction, there were four sessions from the College of Arts & Letters (English) and four for APSU 1000, the First-year Seminar.

As for the number of online courses in which librarians were embedded, there was a decrease from 31 in summer 2018 to 16 in summer 2019, due mostly to APSU having a reduced presence in the Tennessee eCampus. Librarians were embedded in four online graduate Leadership courses, one online graduate Education course, and one undergraduate Leadership course through APSU. The Health Sciences librarian was embedded in eight graduate-level Nursing courses via the Tennessee eCampus, as well as two graduate-level Nursing course through APSU.

Eight librarians provided information literacy in face-to-face sessions or were embedded online during the course of the summer.
