

**Woodward Library**  
**Instruction Offerings Summary**  
**2020-2021 (COVID-19 Period)**

**Instruction for Face-to-Face / Hybrid Courses**

The number of face-to-face / hybrid instruction sessions for the 2020-2021 academic year was negatively impacted by COVID-19. During the fall 2020 and spring 2021 semesters, Library Instruction Rooms (and other campus spaces) were at a lower capacity due to the University's social distancing guidelines that mandated six feet of space between individuals in order to slow the spread of the virus. A move was made toward more pre-pandemic instruction during the summer of 2021.

- Librarians provided information literacy instruction in 58 different sessions to:
  - 542 undergraduate students
  - 94 master's students
  - 22 doctoral students
  - 98 dual enrollment students (plus an audience of 200 dual enrollment students and their family members)
  - 49 middle college students
  - 12 recent high school graduates
  - 4 exchange / non-degree seeking students

### **Instruction for Online Courses**

Librarians were actively embedded in 69 online courses during the 2020-2021 academic year, which is an increase over the previous year. This is not a surprising development, based on the growth in the number of online course offerings due to COVID-19.
