Instruction Offerings Summary
Spring 2021 (COVID-19 Period)

Instruction for Face-to-Face / Hybrid Courses

The number of face-to-face / hybrid instruction sessions for spring semester 2021 was negatively impacted by COVID-19. Librarians taught a total of 11 sessions, a sharp decrease of about 78% from the 52 sessions conducted in spring semester 2020 at the beginning of the pandemic before the University's decision to move all classes online after spring break. Library Instruction Rooms (and other campus spaces) were at a lower capacity due to the University's social distancing guidelines that mandated six feet of space between individuals in order to slow the spread of the virus. As a result, the Library offered an online tutorial as an option to the required face-to-face library information literacy sessions for the first-year seminar course, APSU 1000, which resulted in fewer in-person sessions.

- Librarians provided information literacy instruction to 99 undergraduate students and 10 doctoral students enrolled in face-to-face / hybrid sections.
- Six sessions were held in one of our Library Instruction Rooms; the other sessions were in Clement (2), the Sundquist Science Complex (1), and the Austin Peay Center at Fort Campbell (1).
- In looking at course instruction offerings by College, there were two in Behavioral & Health Sciences (Political Science & Public Management), two in STEM (Chemistry and Geology), and one in Education (Educational Specialties). Of the sessions, one was for the doctoral program in Educational Leadership.
- There were a total of five APSU 1000 – *Freshman Seminar* library sessions, including one at the Fort Campbell Campus.
- One session was not for a course, but an orientation for 28 dual enrollment students taught by the Education Librarian via Zoom.

Instruction for Online Courses

Librarians were actively embedded in 18 online courses during spring semester 2021, which is a surge of 500% compared to three courses in spring semester 2020. This is not a surprising development, based on the increase in online course offerings due to COVID-19.

- Librarians provided instruction to 292 undergraduate students and 23 master's level students.
- In looking at course instruction offerings by College, there were seven in Behavioral & Health Sciences (3 Leadership & Organizational Administration, 2 Criminal Justice, and 2 Sociology), and three in Arts & Letters (2 in History & Philosophy and 1 in Women's & Gender Studies). Of the total sessions, one was for a Master's-level course in Leadership & Organizational Administration.
- Librarians were actively embedded in eight sections of APSU 1000 – *Freshman Seminar*, six of which were at the Fort Campbell Campus.
- By term, there were seven Clarksville Campus Full Spring courses, four Fort Campbell Spring I courses, and two Fort Campbell Campus Spring II courses, as well as five combined courses across multiple campuses or terms (1 Wintermester/Spring I, 2 Spring A/Spring I, and 2 Spring B/Spring II).
