

**Woodward Library**  
**Instruction Offerings Summary**  
**Summer 2021 (COVID-19 Period)**

**Instruction for Face-to-Face / Hybrid Courses**

The number of face-to-face / hybrid instruction sessions for summer 2021 continued to be impacted by COVID-19. Librarians taught a total of 11 sessions, compared to the 8 sessions conducted during summer 2020.

- Librarians provided information literacy instruction in one face-to-face / hybrid course to 16 undergraduate students.
- Nine sessions were not for courses, but were library orientation sessions:
  - 2 sessions for 15 undergraduate students as part of special Gov's R.O.W events;
  - 1 session for 41 master's students, 2 undergraduate students, and 4 exchange students in the International Student Orientation;
  - 1 session for 30 master's students in the CSQM and MAEd graduate student cohort;
  - 1 session for 25 undergraduate students in TRIO Student Support Services;
  - 1 session for 22 dual enrollment students;
  - 1 session for 49 middle college students;
  - 1 session for 200 dual enrollment students (including their families)
  - 1 session for 12 recent high school graduates in a summer bridge program
- With a move toward more pre-pandemic instruction, one session was conducted remotely via Zoom, while for another hybrid session, some students attended in-person and others participated via Zoom. For the face-to-face sessions, seven were held in one of our Library Instruction Rooms and three sessions were in the Morgan University Center.
- In looking at course instruction offerings by College, there was one in STEM (Allied Health Sciences).
- There was also a library session for APSU 1000 – *Freshman Seminar* for 48 dual enrollment students.

**Instruction for Online Courses**

The Social Sciences Librarian was actively embedded in seven courses, providing the entirety of the online instruction during summer 2021. Comparatively, during summer 2020, three librarians were embedded in 12 online courses.

- There were 39 undergraduate students enrolled in three different sections, and 35 master's students enrolled in four different sections.
- In looking at course instruction offerings by College, there were five in Behavioral & Health Sciences, all in Leadership & Organizational Administration, with four of the five being master's-level courses.
- The Social Sciences Librarian was also embedded in two sections of APSU 1000 – *Freshman Seminar*.
- By term, there was one Summer I session and six Summer III sessions, all offered through the Fort Campbell Campus.
